Pierce College Strategic Plan Return to VIII, Annual Goals Return to IX, Long-Range Goals

Goal 1: Pierce College will offer excellent, responsive instructional programs to facilitate and improve student learning.

Objectives:

1.1 Develop instructional programs which best meet the learning needs of our students.

1.2 Enhance the quality of teaching pedagogy in all academic and career education programs to help students achieve their learning goals.

1.3 Align Pierce's planning documents, mission statement, student learning outcomes, course outlines, and content delivery to address and meet the diversity of student learner needs.

1.4 Utilize institutional research to acquire data and develop a model for understanding and addressing the challenges faced and needs of our student learners.

1.5 Focus on recruiting students, retaining and preparing them through comprehensive programs and services that address their academic, personal, cultural, and financial needs.

1.6 Develop ways to support existing programs.

1.7 Develop an annual program planning process to complement the multi-annual program reviews and support data collection for collegewide planning and decision-making processes.

1.8 Develop SLO definition and assessment for all active courses, programs, certificates, and degrees.

1.9 Expand and enhance the development of student information competencies.

1.10 Enhance instructional support services to students. This includes a focus on basic skills development and the use of proven information technologies to complement instructional programs.

2.8 Promote access to the institution and expand learning opportunities that develop personal and civic responsibility to increase student understanding and appreciation of diversity.

Goal 3: Pierce College will enhance the learning environment to be culturally and pedagogically diverse.

Objectives:

3.1 Focus on student and community demographics to build a college workforce which mirrors those demographics and provide and models success.

3.2 Increase awareness and appreciation of diversity in all its forms among all members of the college community.

3.3 Encourage faculty to introduce and utilize awareness of diversity in the curriculum and all elements of the student learning experience.

Goal 4: Pierce College will expand the effective use of technology in all areas of the college.

Objectives:

4.1 Develop plans for maintaining and upgrading the technology infrastructure of the college.

4.2 Establish a long-range perspective for identifying and implementing a media-rich student learning environment.

4.3 Utilize developments in technology for distance education, student services and learning support to improve student access, retention and success.

4.4 Develop and institutionalize instructional support services for technologically enhanced learning environments

4.5 Develop strategies to increase the use of technology to support student learning in the library and The Learning Center.

4.6 Implement an Information Technology Department staffing plan and the Technology Plan to improve student support and college service.

Goal 5: Pierce College will enhance it relationships with the community at large.
